We are thrilled to announce that blind explorer Lonnie Bedwell, who inspired our Year 4, 5, and 6 students during his presentation at KJS in May, is embarking on an incredible Antarctica adventure.

As many of you will remember, Lonnie's journey is part of his ambitious quest to climb the tallest mountains on all seven continents and ski to both the North and South Poles. Just this week, Lonnie landed at Union Glacier Station in Antarctica, and he is gearing up to climb Vinson Massif, standing tall at 4,892 meters. His climb could start as soon as today and is expected to take about a week! Following this, he will brave the elements for 2 to 3 weeks as he skis to the South Pole.

KJS students will hopefully have the chance to follow Lonnie's journey in real time! Here's how you can stay updated:
